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GLOSSARY

Prevalence	: the proportion of population with specific characteristics in a given period
Experimental drug use	: a person who uses drugs less than 5 times in the past year from the time of survey
Recreational drug use	: a person who uses drugs 5 to 49 times in the past year from the time of survey
Dependent drug use	: a person who uses drugs more than 49 times in the past year from the time of survey
Injecting drug use	: a person who injects a drug regardless of the amount, in the past year from the time of survey
Handycraft	: Art activities focussing on hand skills and function to process raw materials often found in the environment into things that are not only worth using, but also have aesthetic value
Volunteer	: person who voluntarily does something (not because it is required nor enforced)
Activator	: person who evokes activities, enthusiasm, excitement, and so on
Switch Profession	: diversion or alteration of work
Narcotics	: substances or drugs originating from plants or non-plants, both synthetic and semi-synthetic which can cause a decrease or change in consciousness, loss of pain and can cause dependence
Psychotropic Substances	: substances or drugs, both natural and synthetic not narcotics, that have a psychoactive effect through selective influence on the central nervous system causing typical changes in mental activity and behavior
Dangerous Substances	: chemicals either in a single or mixed form, that have toxic, carcinogenic, teratogenic, mutagenic, corrosive and irritant properties, that can directly or indirectly endanger health and the environment
HIV	: a virus that causes AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome)
AIDS	: collection of symptoms and infections / syndromes that arise to cause damage to the human immune system due to infection with the HIV virus
IDU	: a category of drug abuse that has an extension of Narcotics, Psychotropic, other addictive substances that are used using syringes
Heterosexual	: romantic attraction, sexual attraction, or sexual habits towards people of the opposite sex or gender
Homosexual	: sexual attraction in the form of sexual partner disorientation, namely a person's tendency to be engaged in a sexual behavior with the same-sex
Bisexual	: is a sexual orientation that has the characteristics of aesthetic attraction, romantic love, and sexual desire for men and women
Prenatal Transmission	: is the transmission of disease from mother to baby during pregnancy, birth, or breastfeeding

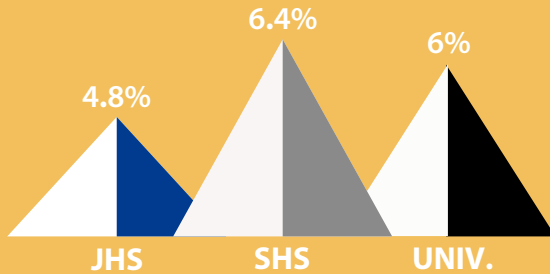

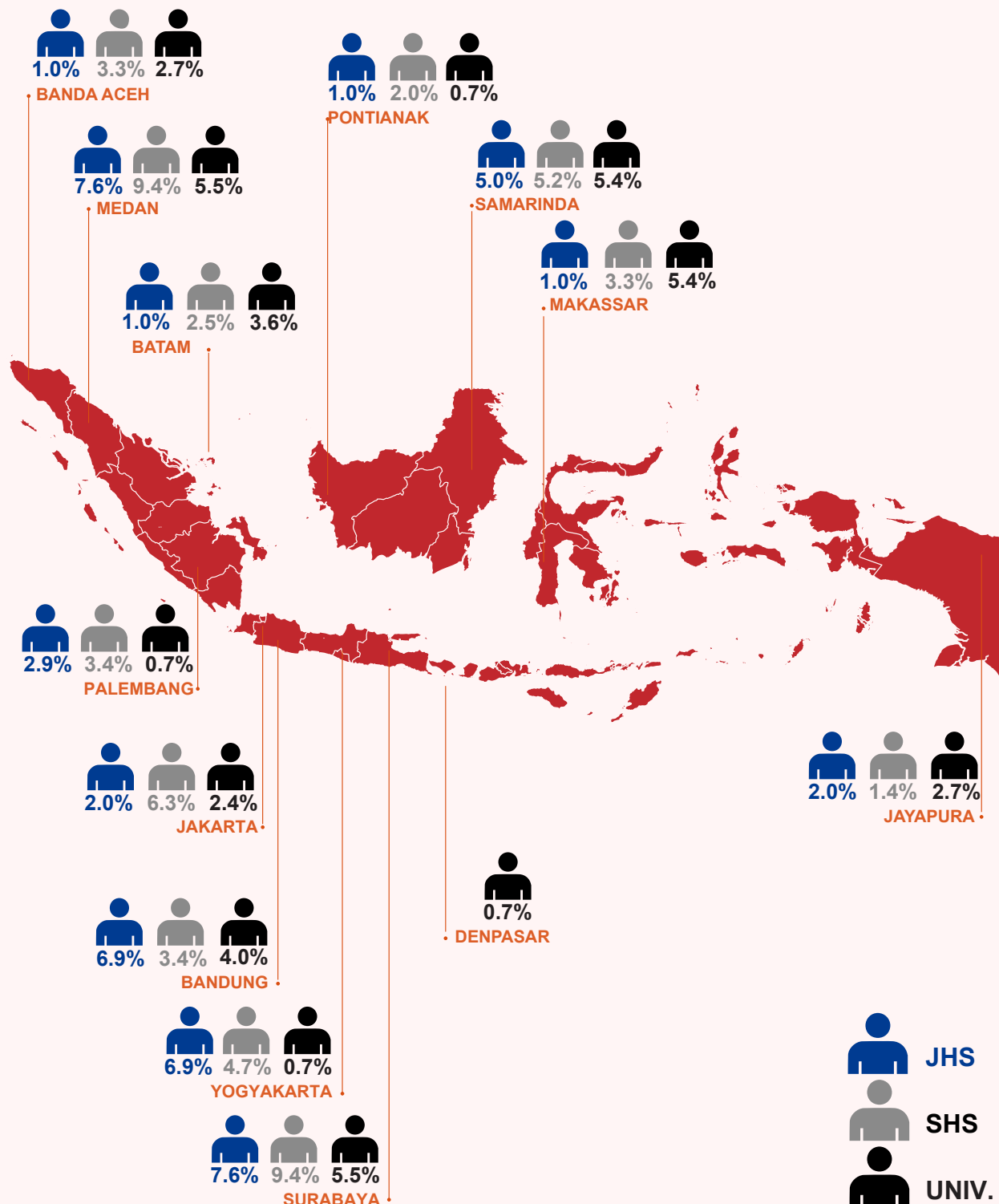

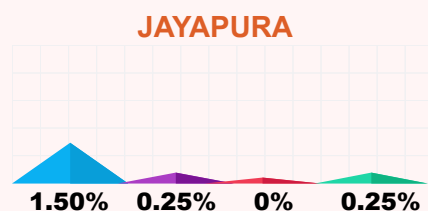
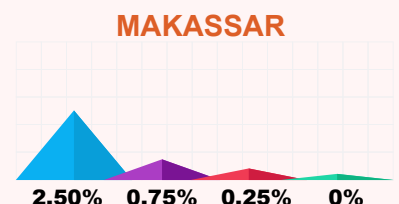
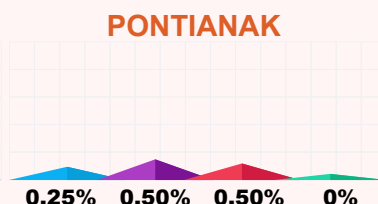
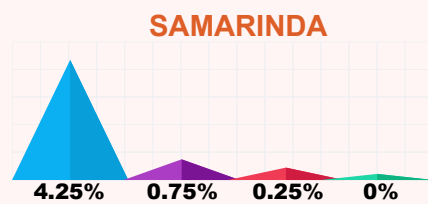
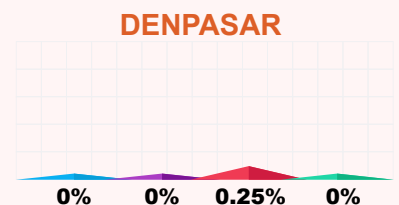
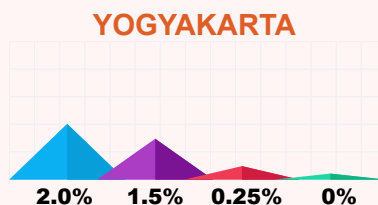
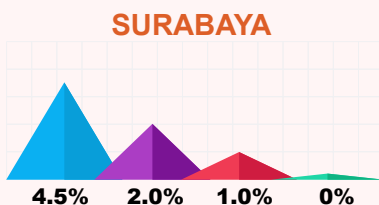
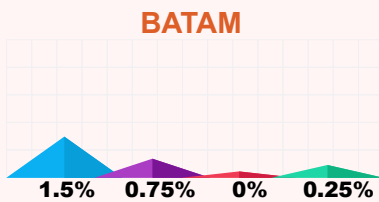
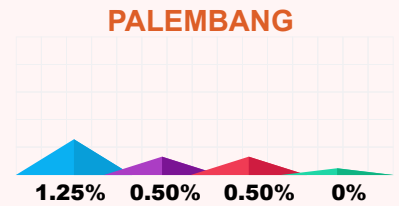
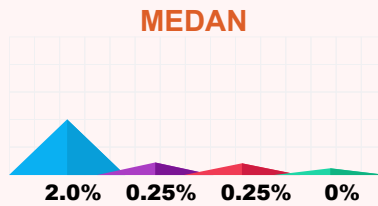
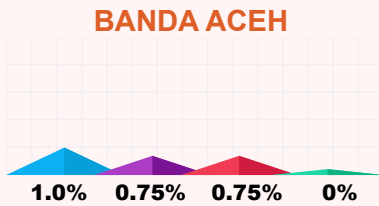
PAST YEAR PREVALENCE RATES AMONG STUDENTS BY EDUCATIONAL LEVEL AND CAPITAL OF PROVINCE

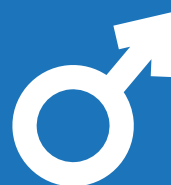

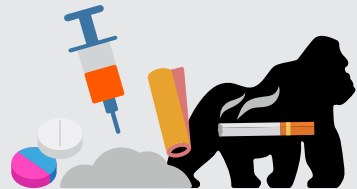

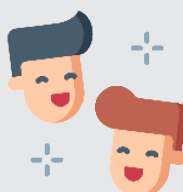

DISTRIBUTION ACTIVITIES OF BNN COMMUNICATION, INFORMATION AND EDUCATION IN 2018

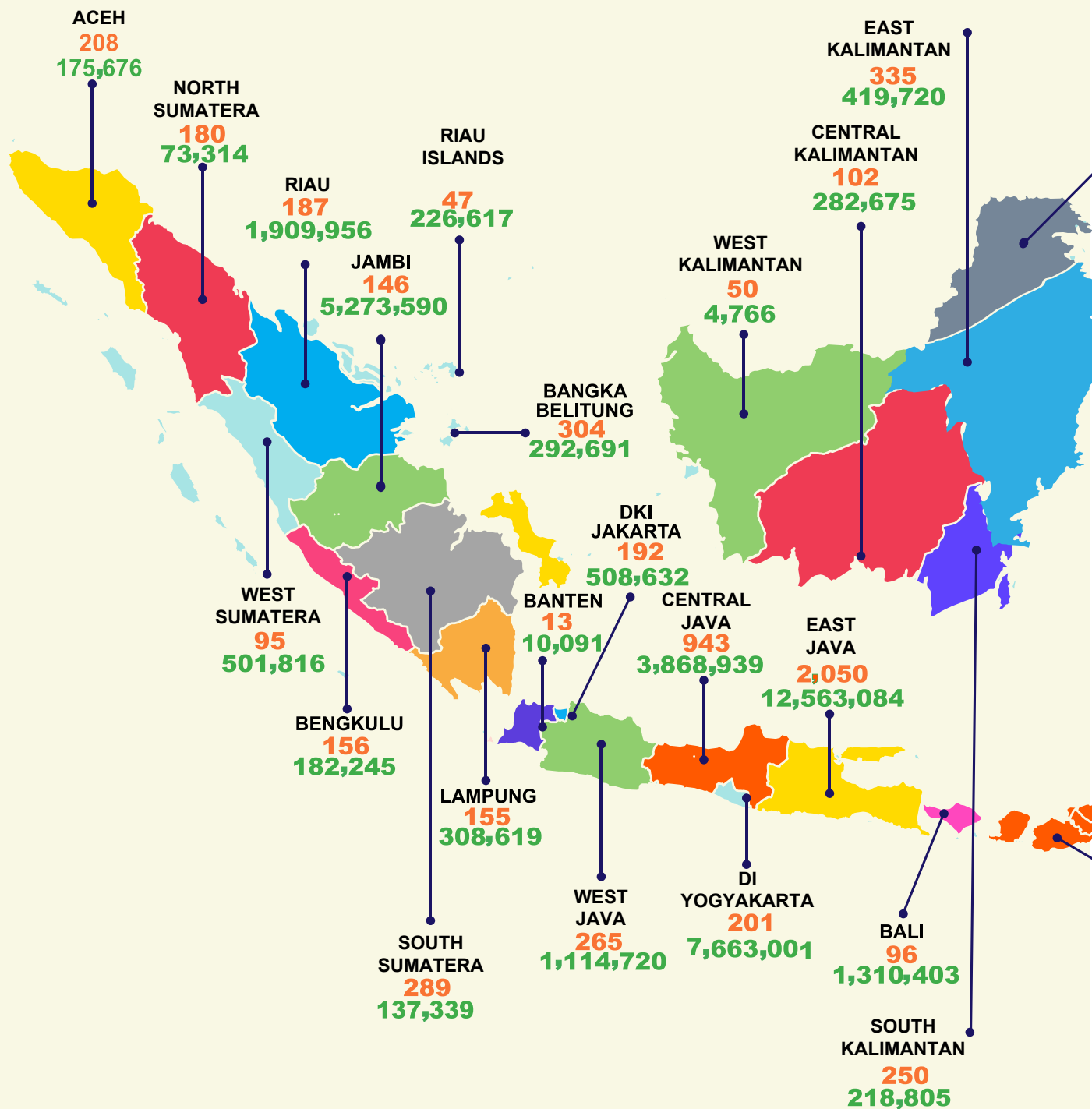


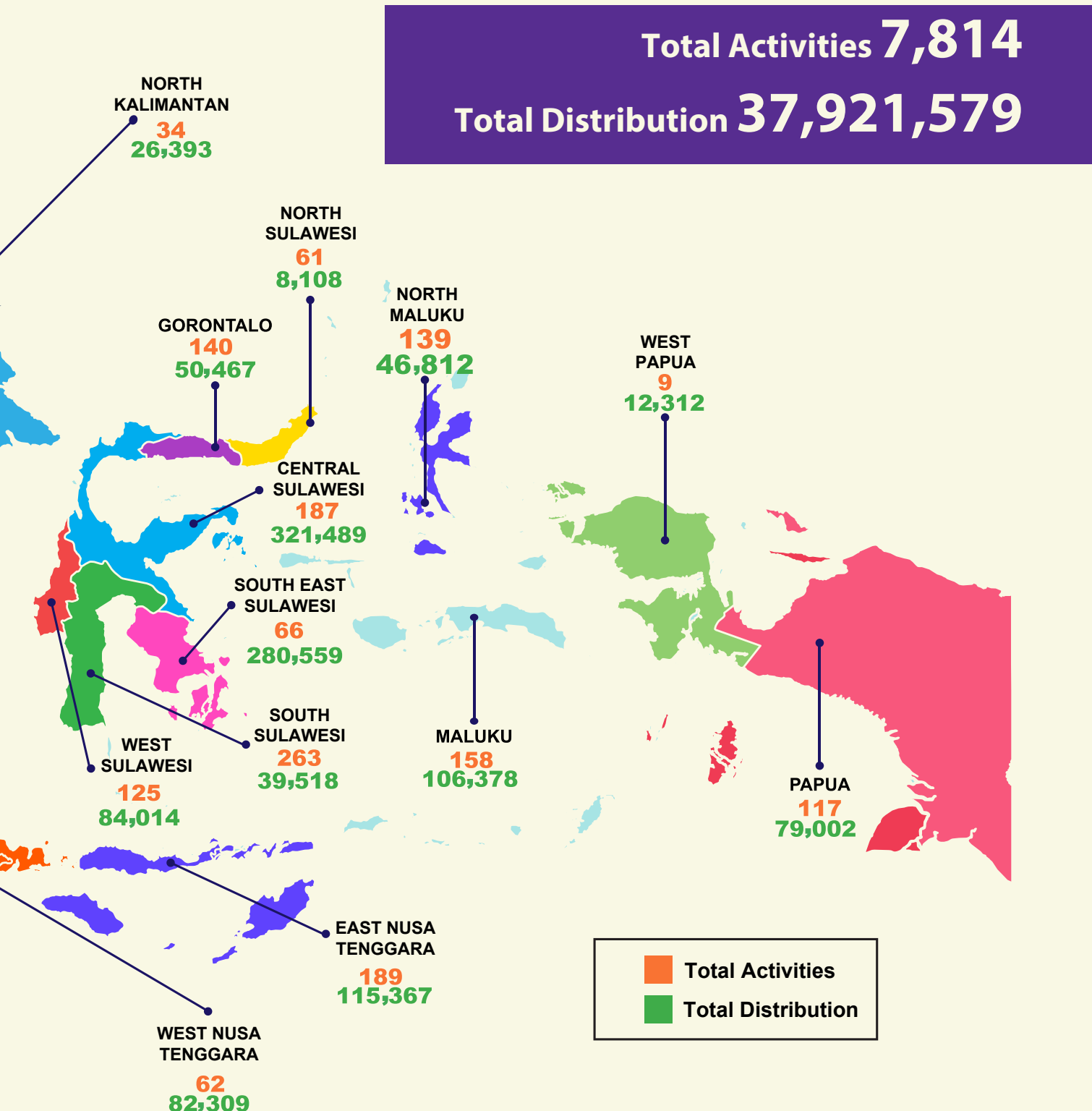

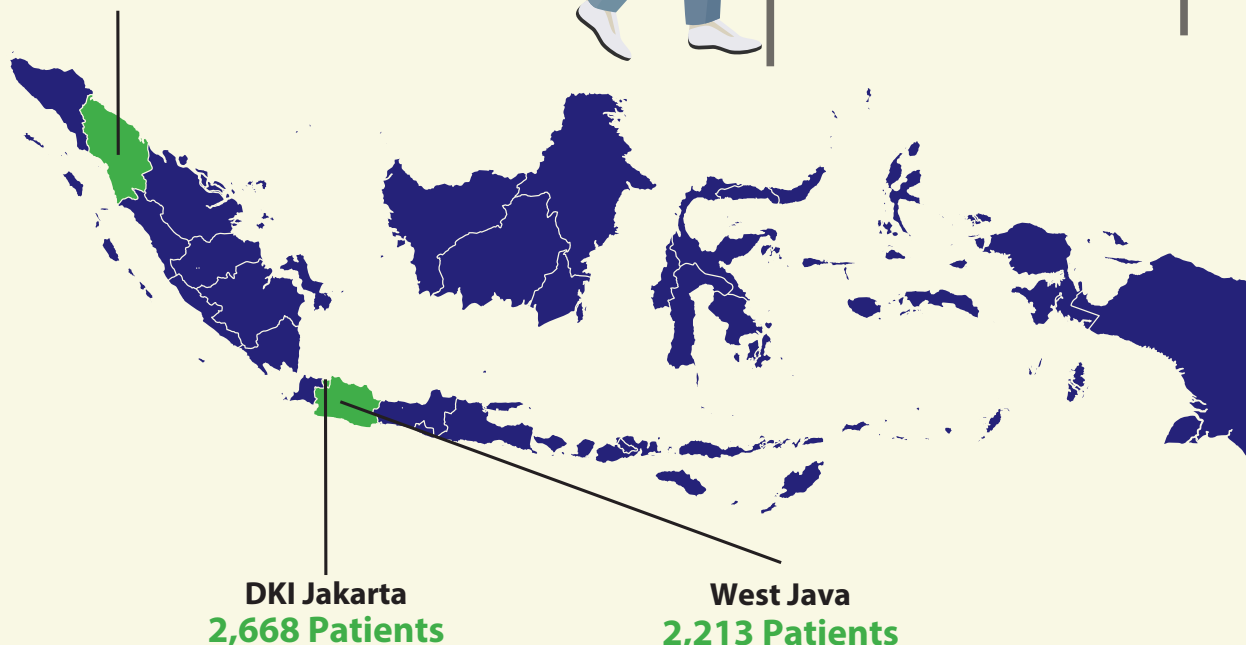

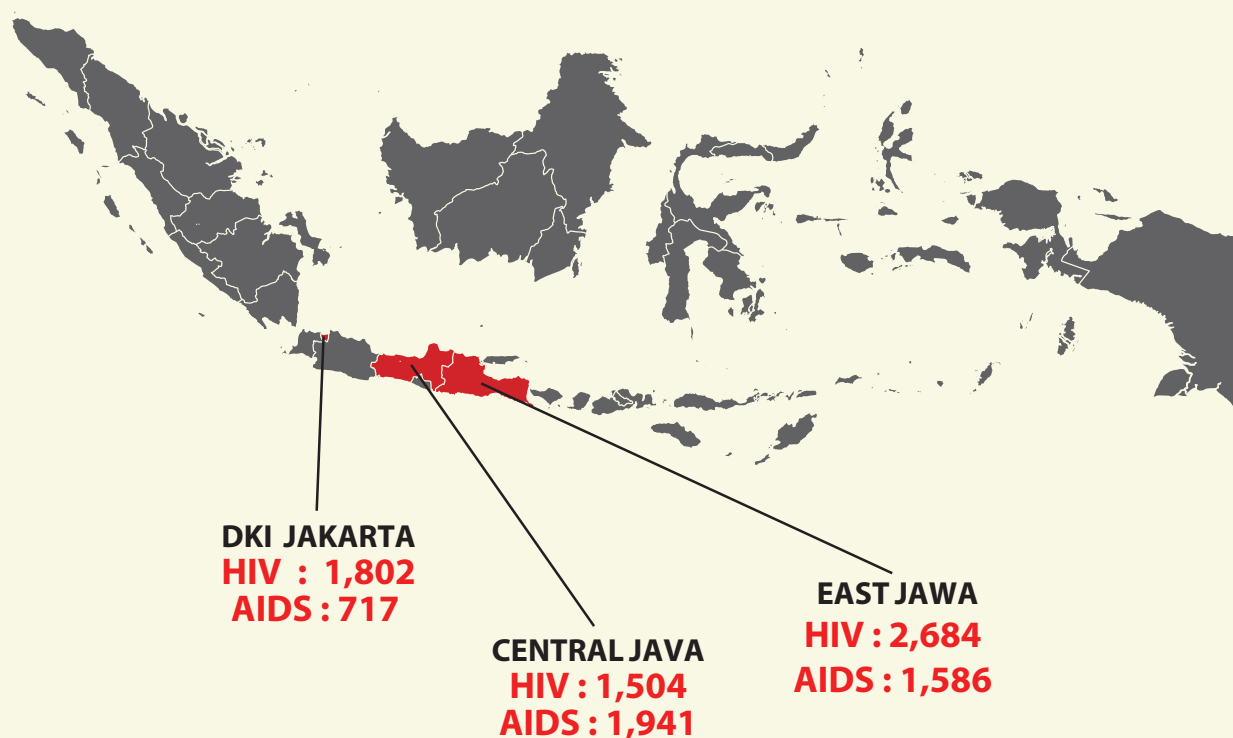

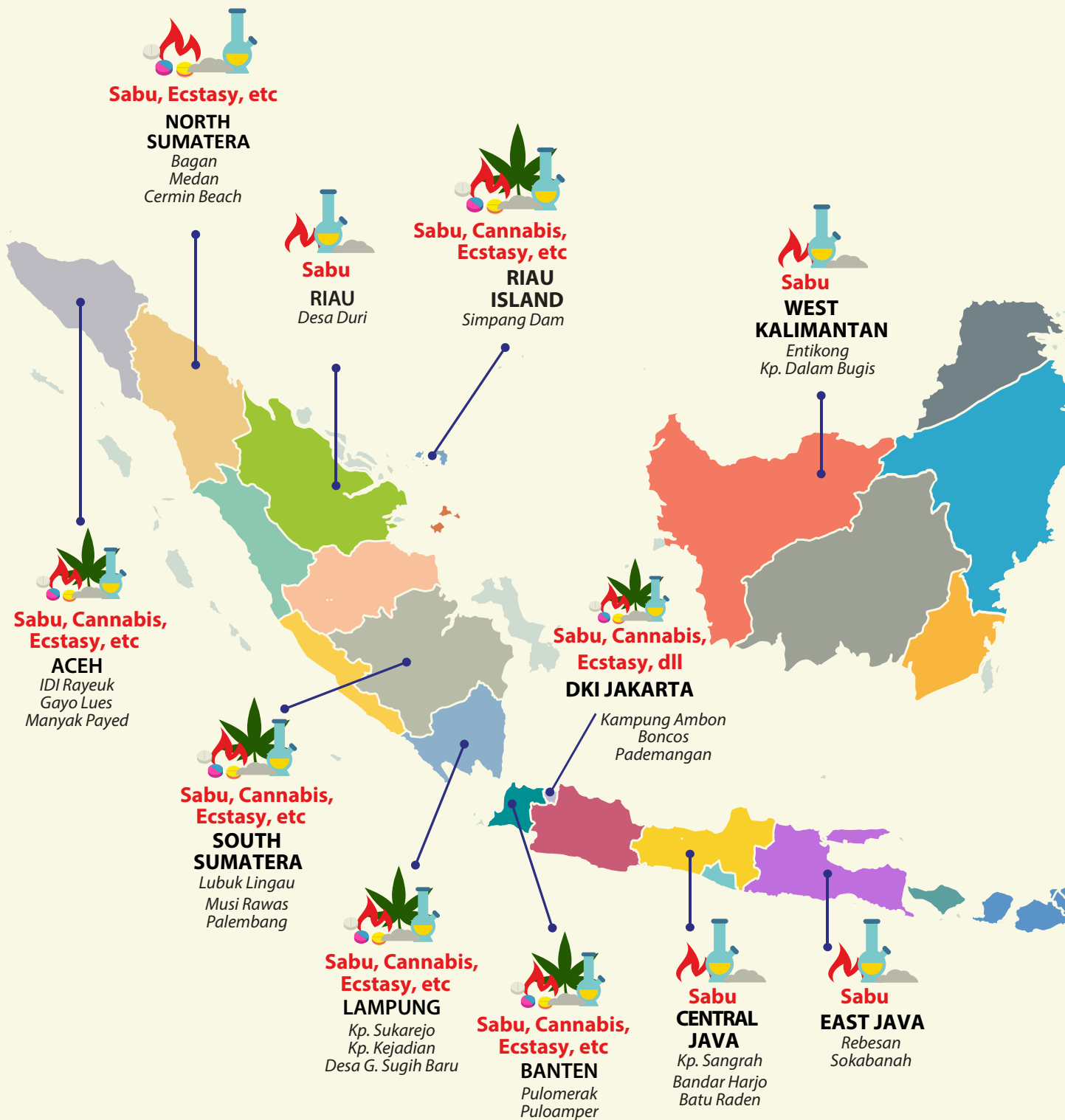

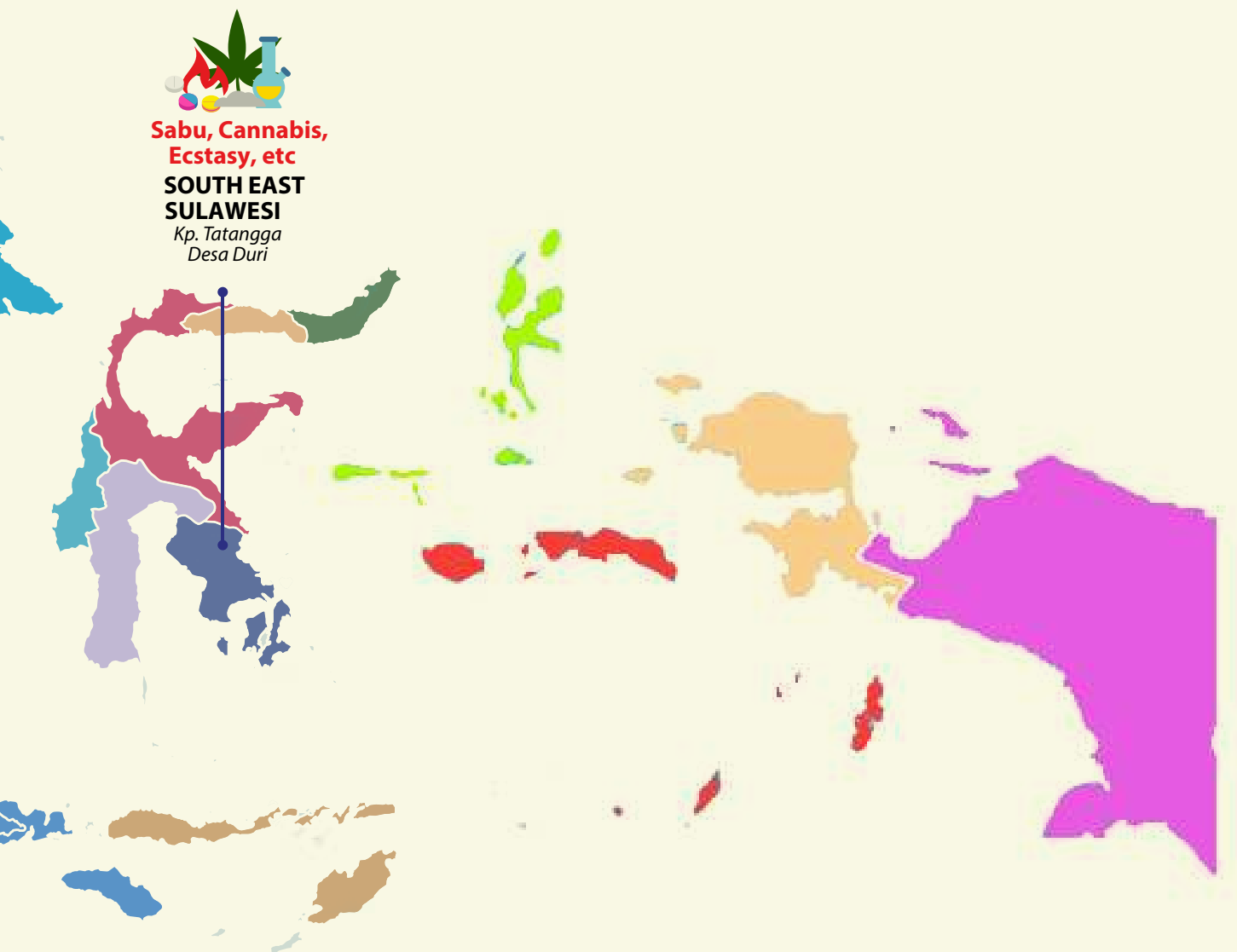

DRUG PRONE AREAS BASED ON TYPE OF DRUG





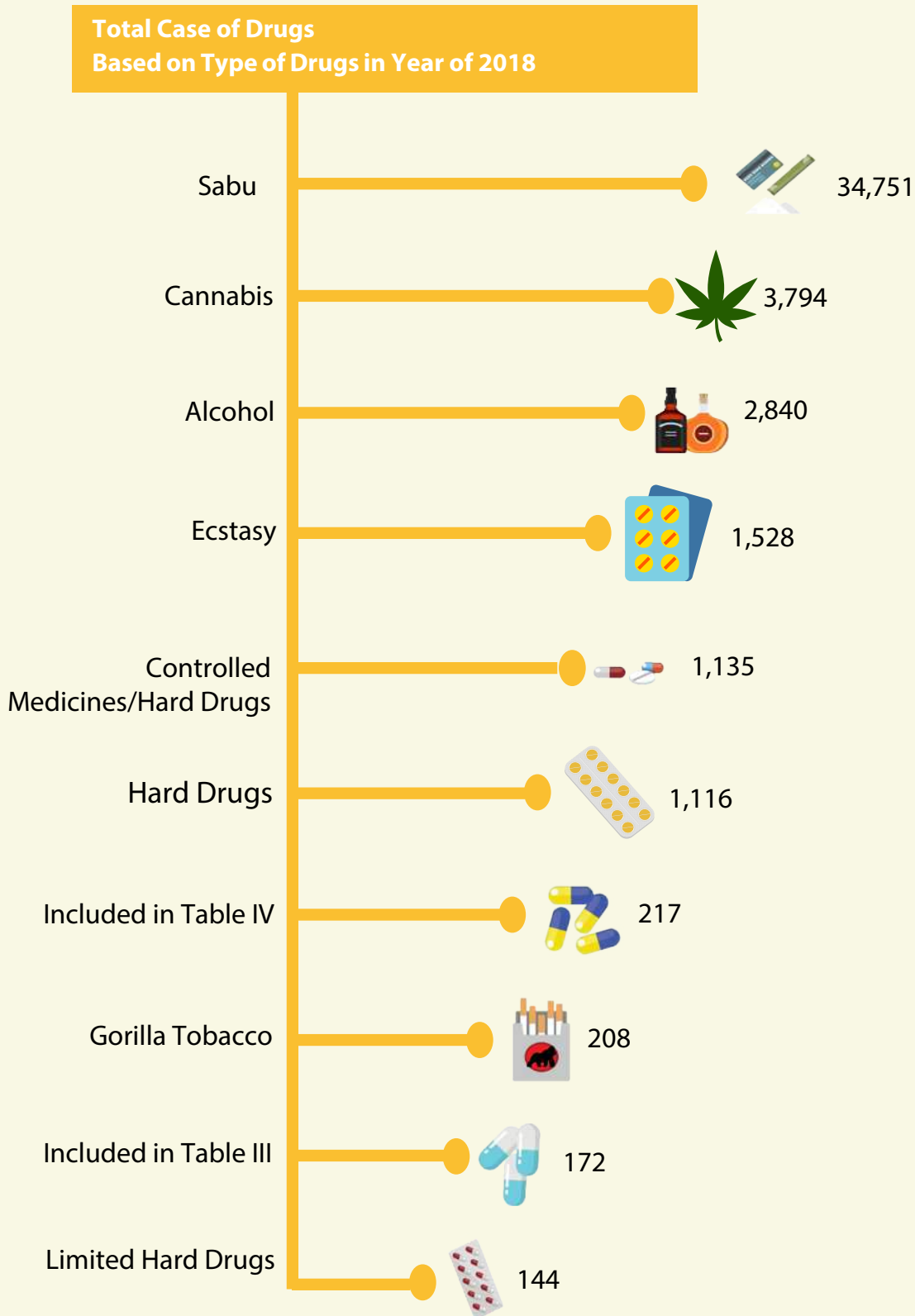

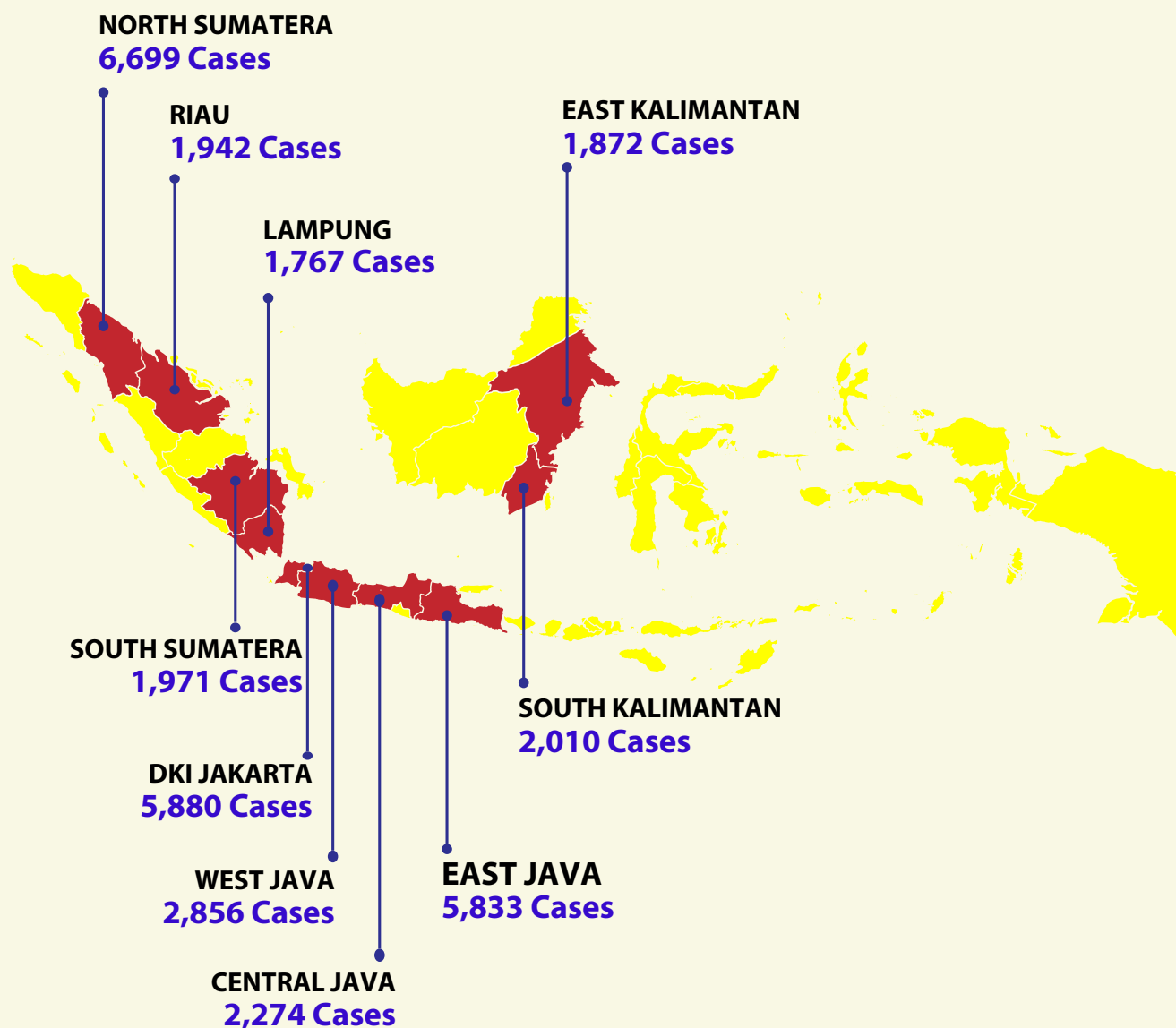

DATA OF DRUG CRIME IN OF 2018



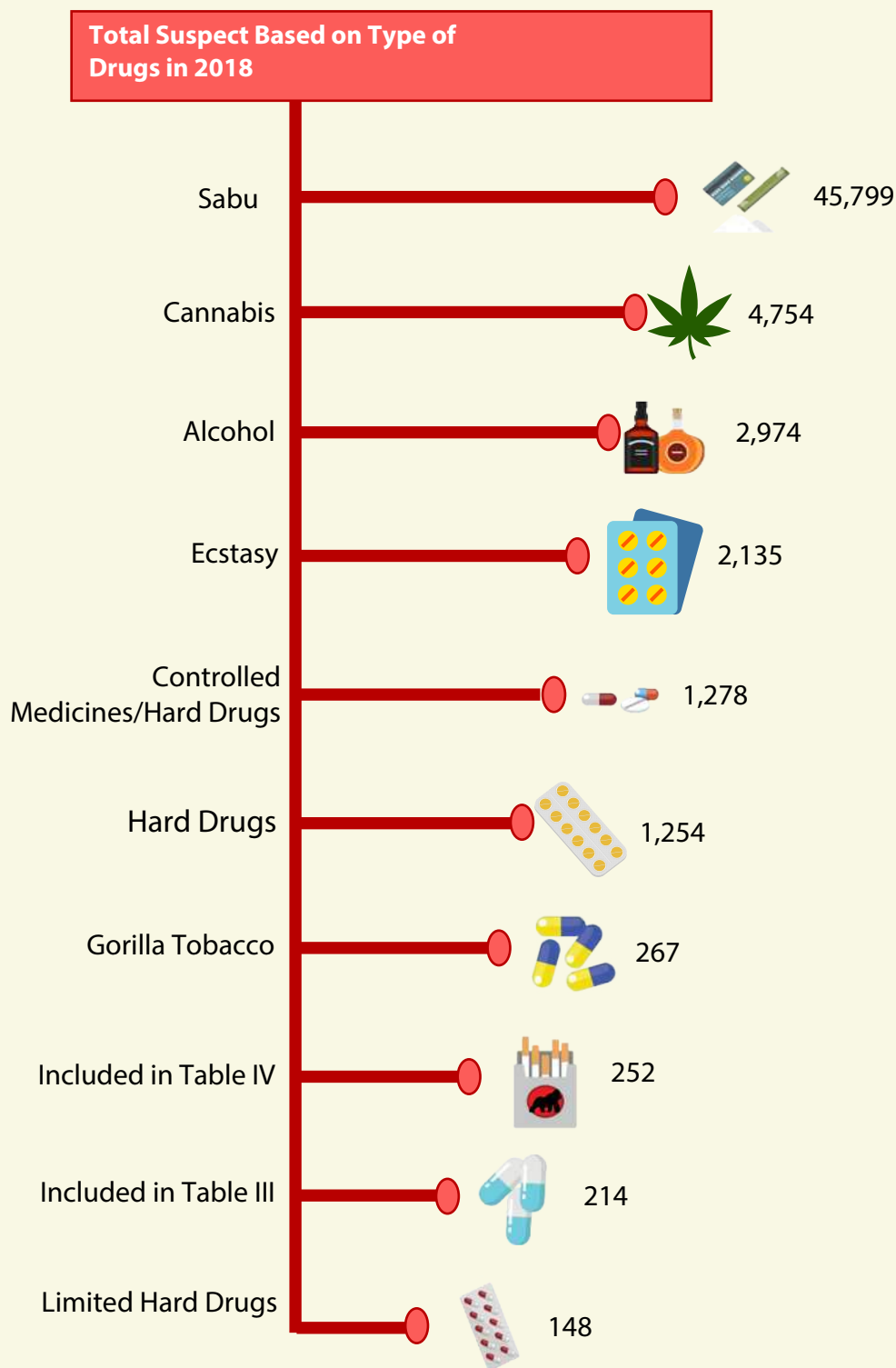

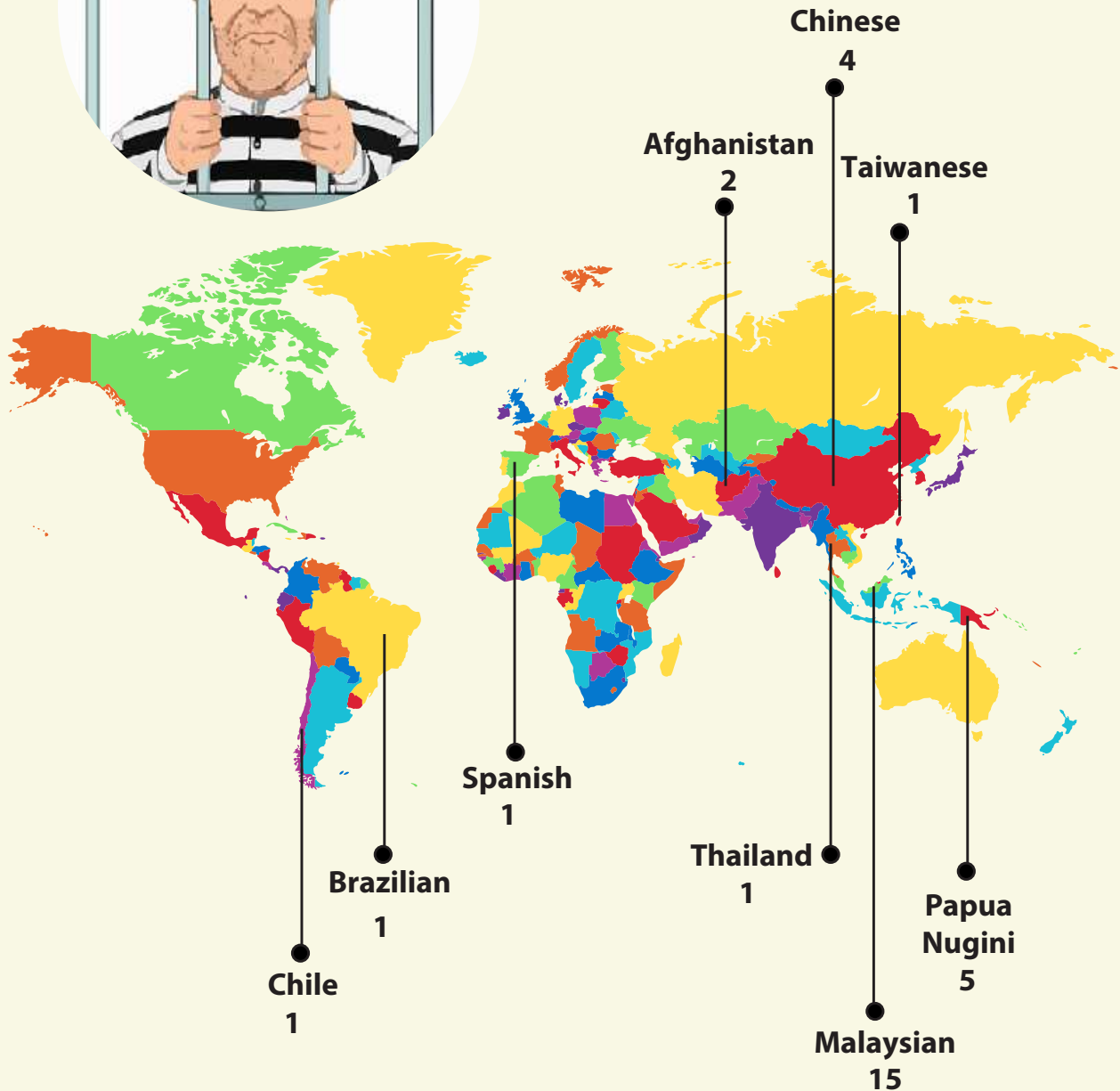

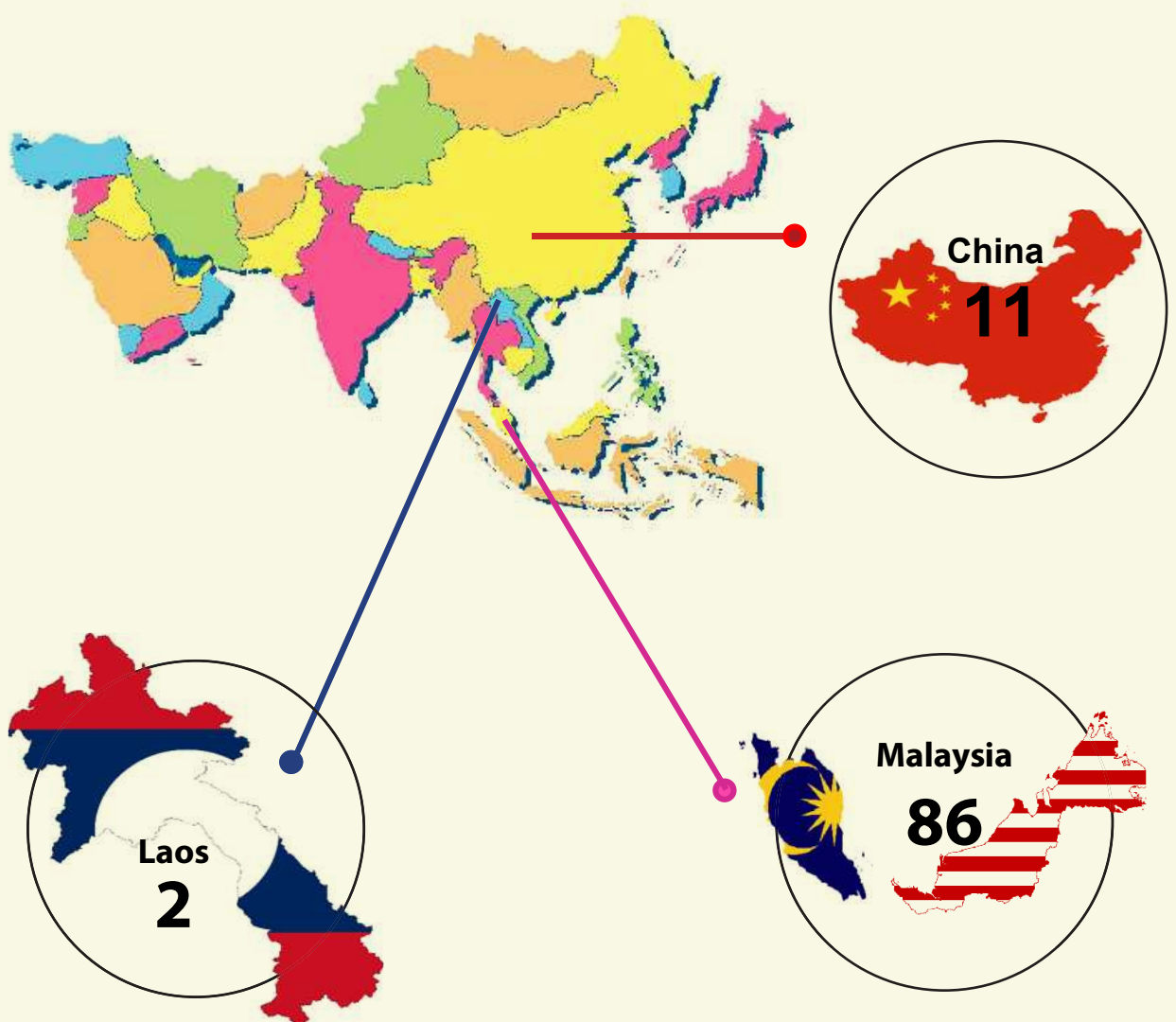

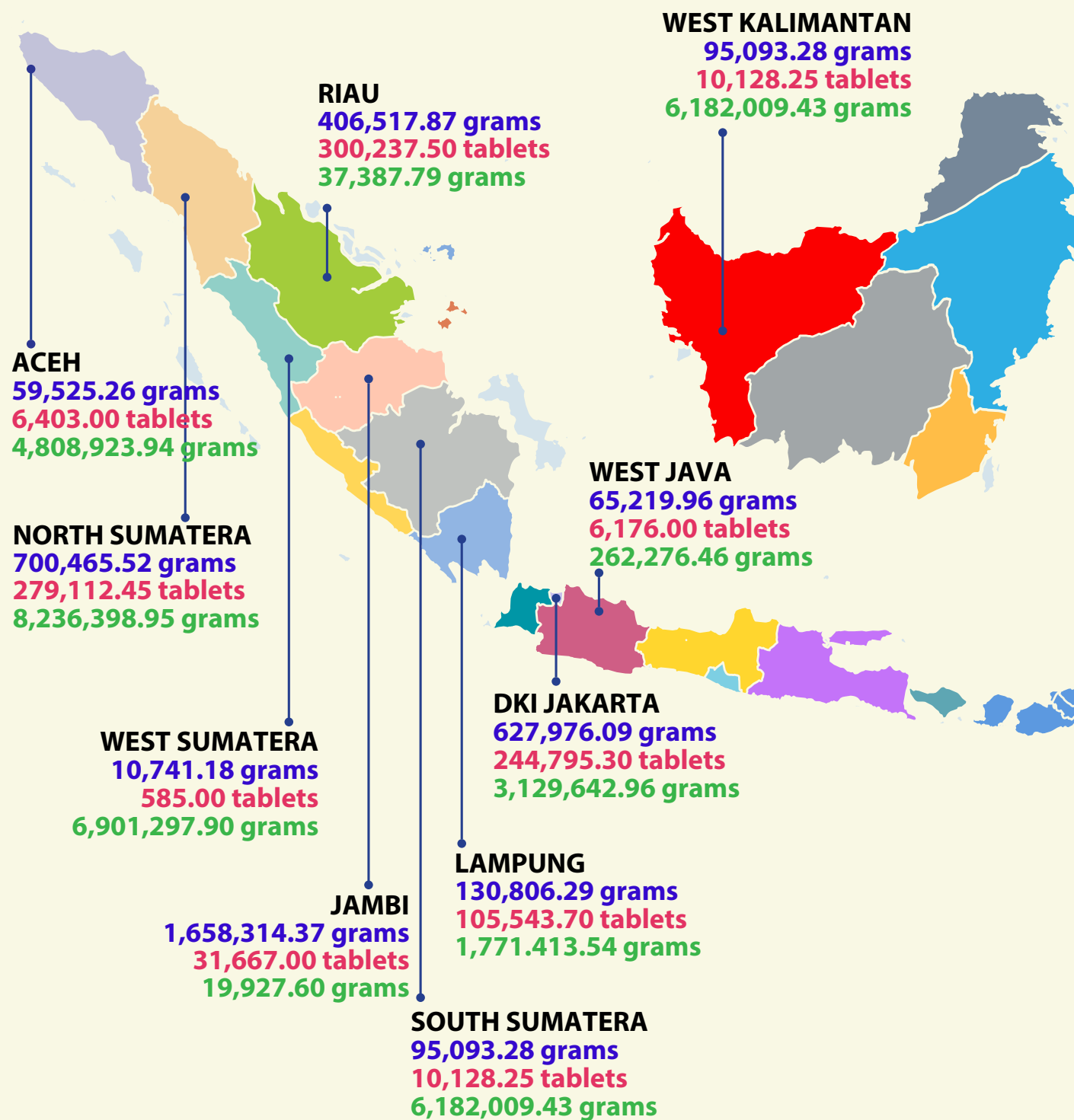

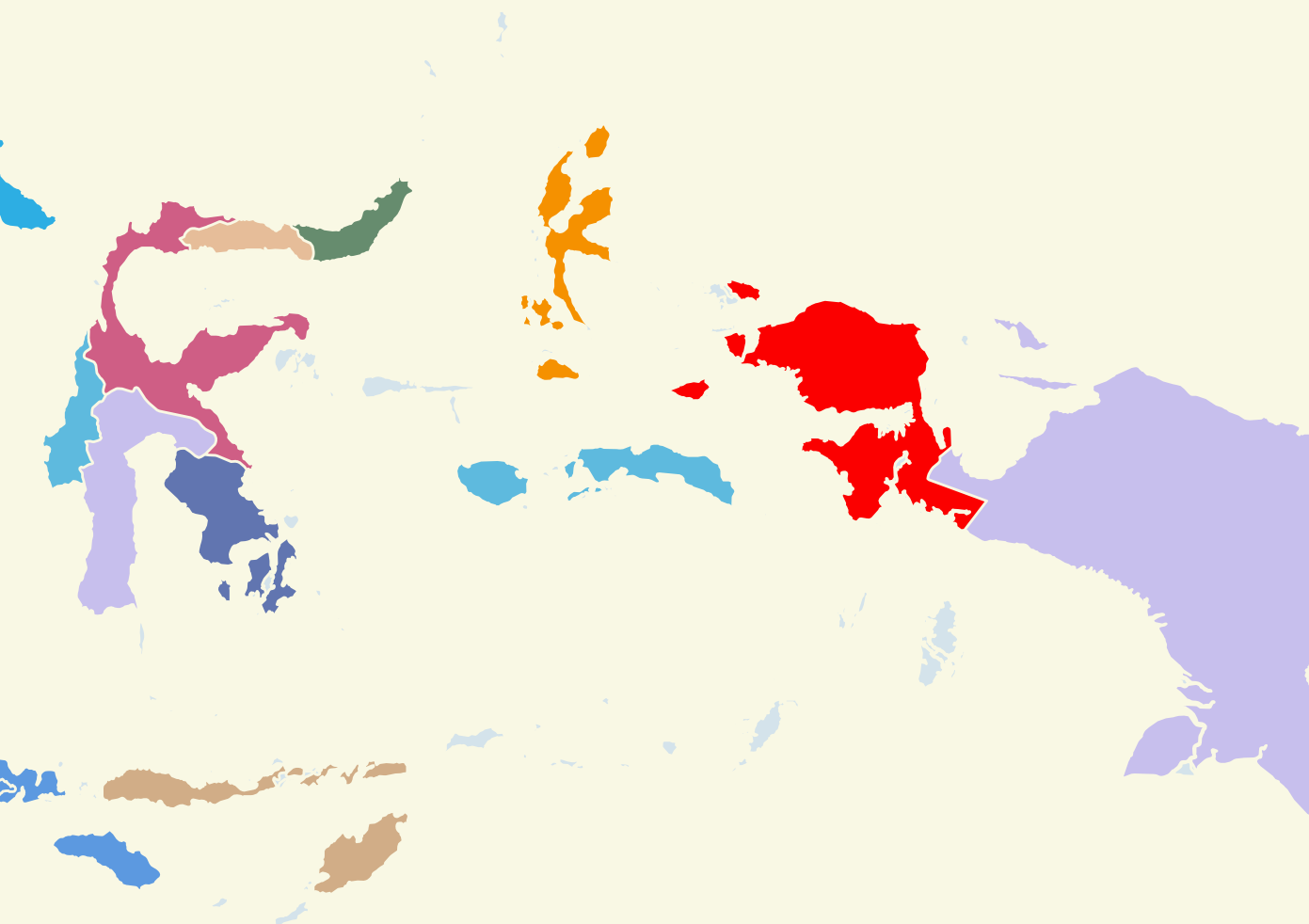

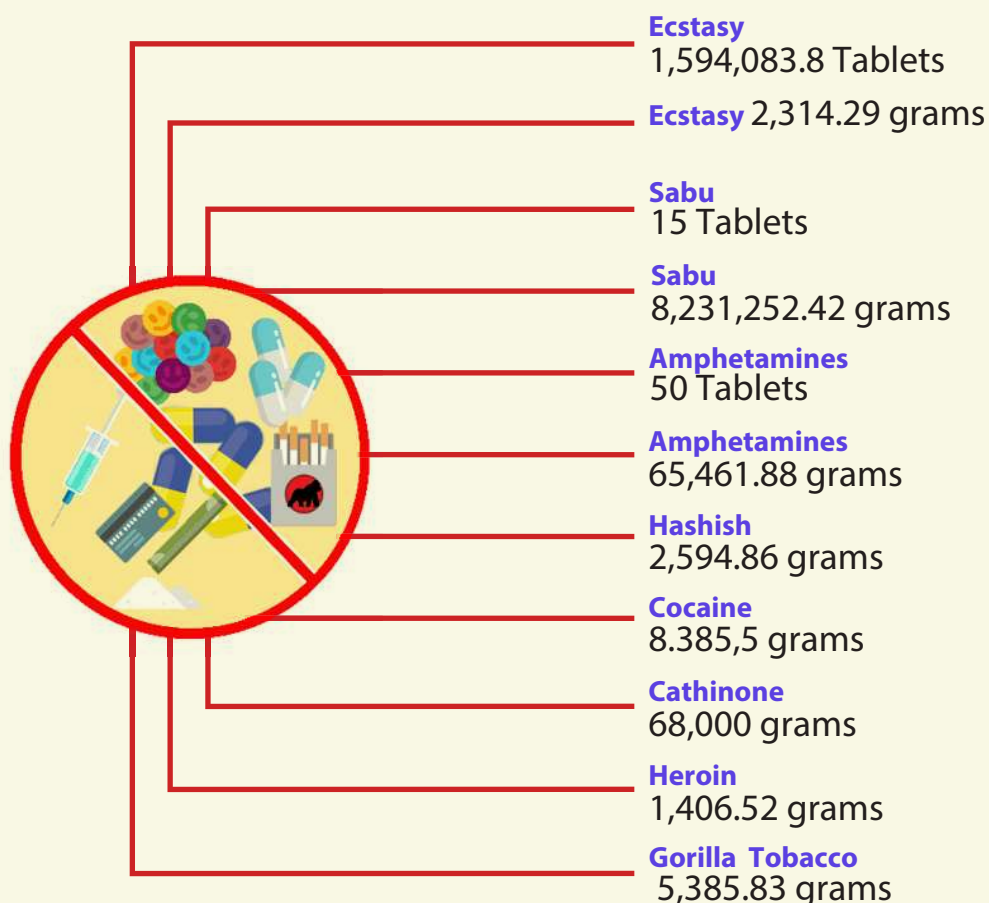

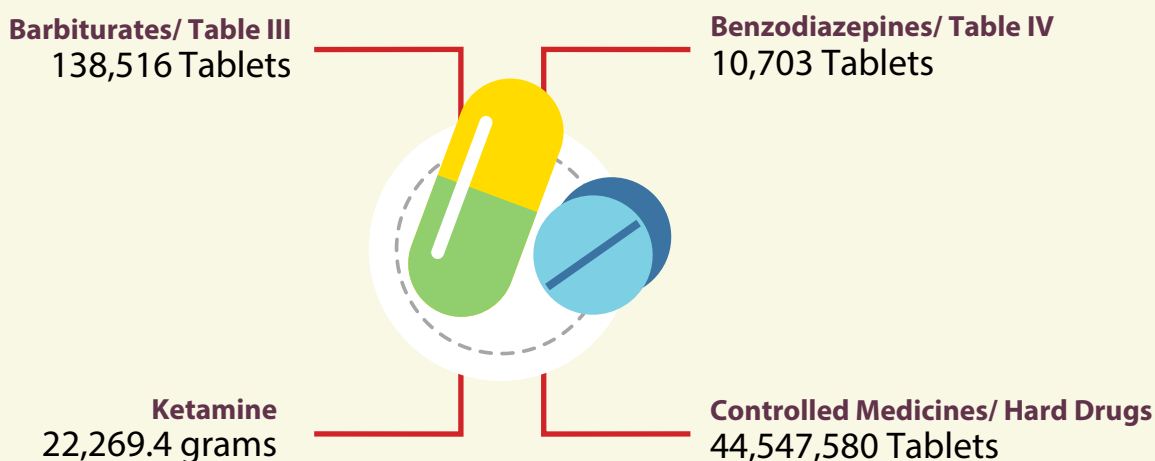

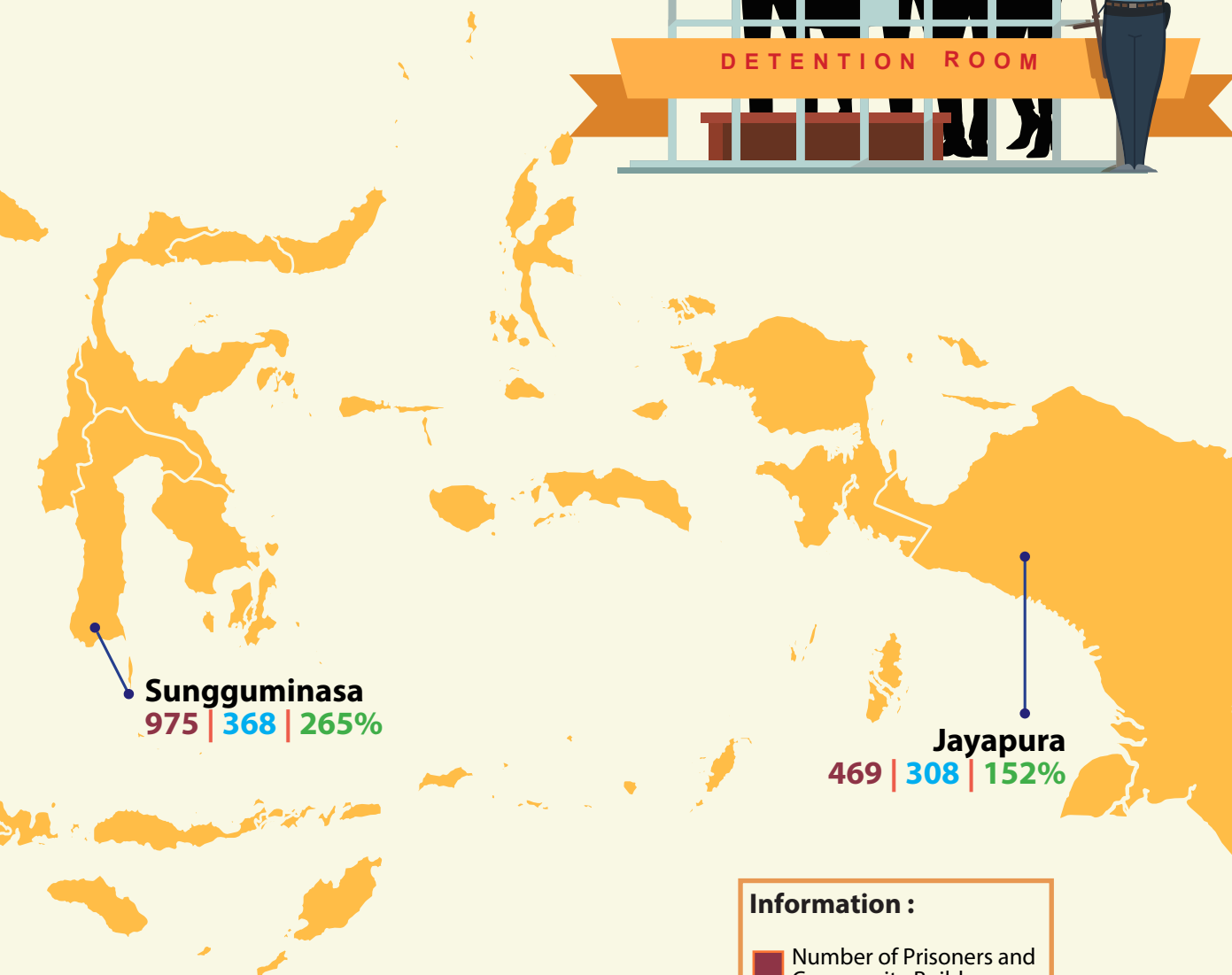

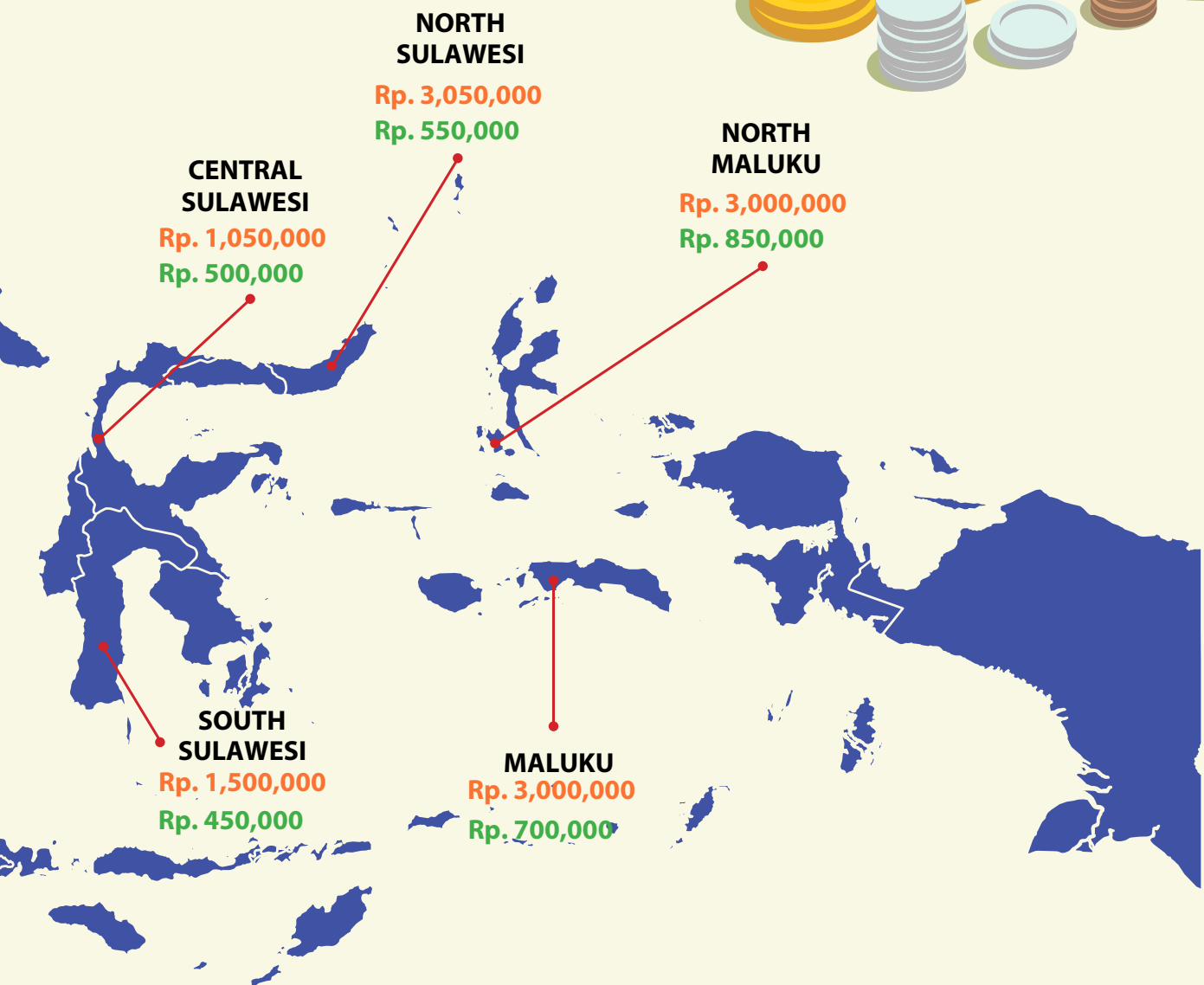
ECSTASY AND CRYSTAL METH MARKET INDONESIA IN 2018

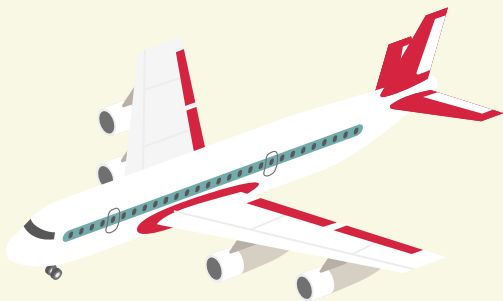

Trend of "Flying Courier"

In 2017 and 2018, the National Narcotics Agency and the Directorate General of Customs and Excise carried out investigations into cases of drug trafficking using the "flying courier" modus operandi through several domestic and international airports. Each suspect smuggles 500 grams to 1 kg of methamphetamine and ecstasy. The 20 airports traversed by smugglers using the "flying courier" modus operandi are airports in Java, Bali, NTB, NTT and Sulawesi.

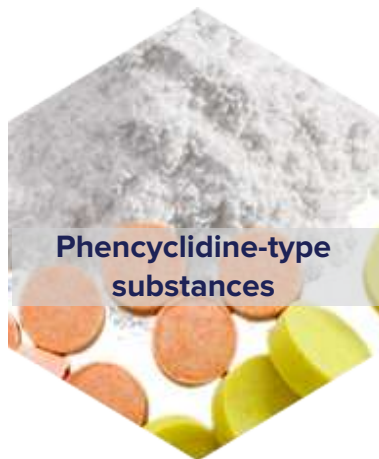

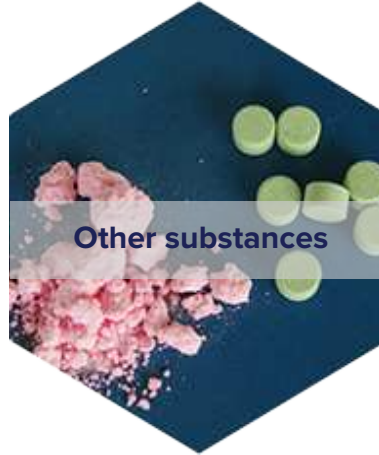
